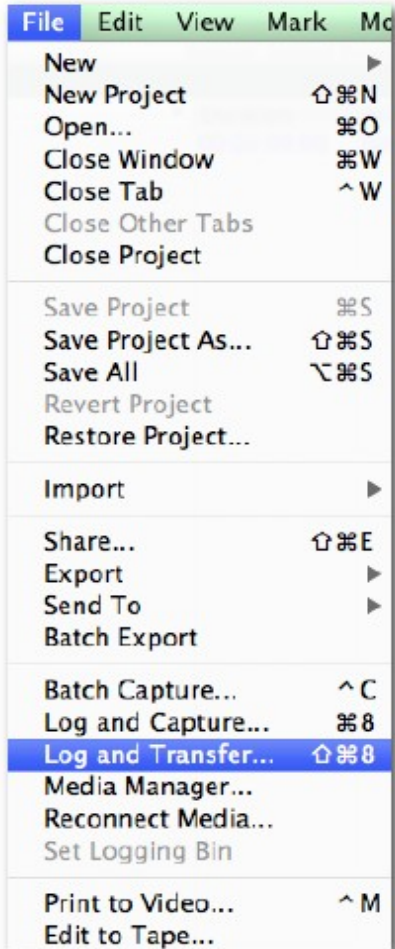


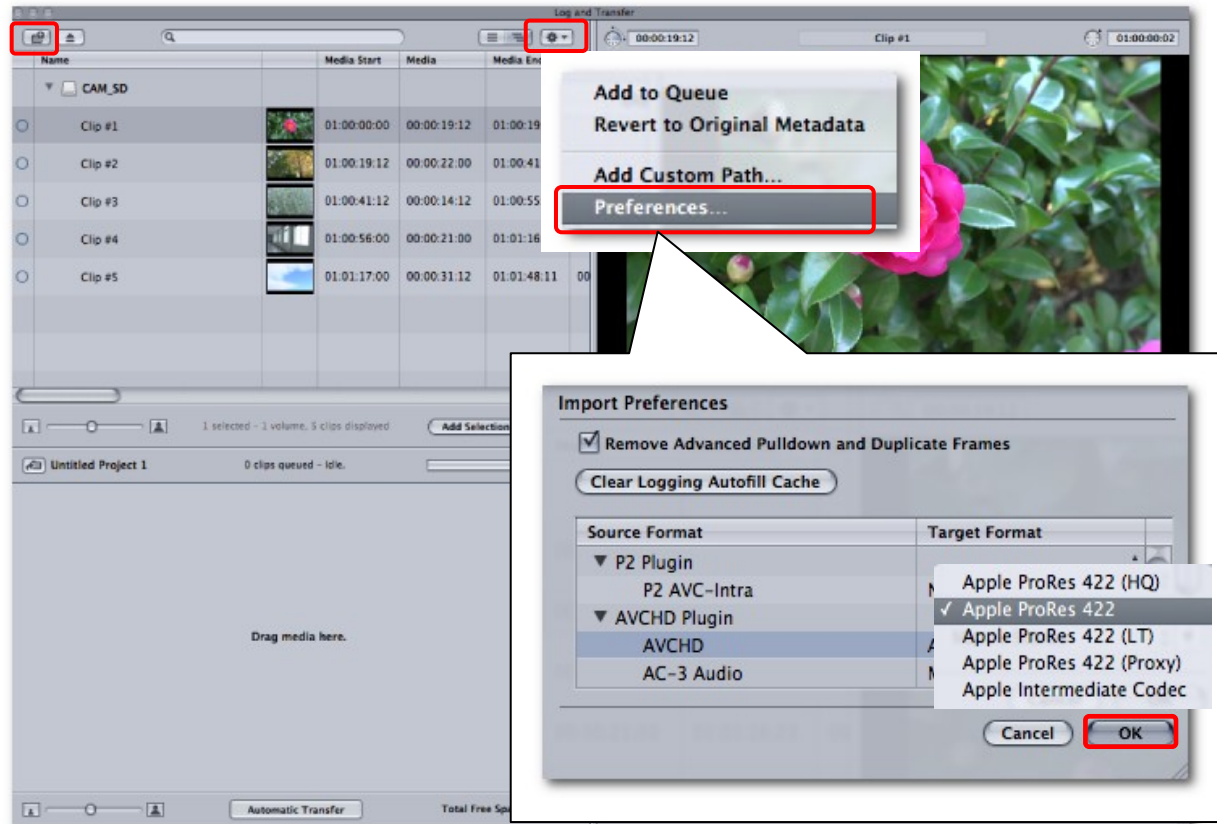
Import AVCHD clips from a SD card on Final Cut Pro 7.

1. Click Log and Transfer...



2. Confirm import settings.

Click icon  to open Import Preference menu.



Select target format and click OK.

Note: When importing copied AVCHD folder on hard disk drive, click icon  to select the target path.

3. Select desired clips and click “Add Selection to Queue”, or drag them into the queue to import.
